CWC Approves Funding for Septic System Repairs, Future Stormwater and Flood Hazard Projects

ARKVILLE, N.Y., February 10, 2022– On February 1, the Catskill Watershed Corporation (CWC) Board of Directors approved funding for several projects in the Septic, Stormwater and Flood Hazard Mitigation Programs.

Twelve homeowners in nine towns in Delaware, Greene, Schoharie and Ulster Counties were awarded reimbursement grants for septic repairs or replacements.

The CWC Board also approved funding for a business in the Town of Middletown for engineering and construction costs of stormwater requirements associated with building four new self-storage buildings. The stormwater controls included installation of gravel diaphragms, grass filter strips, two bio-retention basins, culvert outlet protection and reconstruction of an existing swale.

Funding for a feasibility study for flood mitigation of a structure in the Town of Ashland under the Flood Hazard Mitigation Implementation Program was also approved by the CWC Board.

Lastly, Walton Central School was approved for additional funding for design and construction costs for the Townsend Elementary School floodproofing project in the Village of Walton.

The CWC is a locally based and locally staffed non-profit Local Development Corporation responsible for several environmental protection, economic development, and education programs in the New York City Watershed West of the Hudson River.
