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## **CWC Approves Funding for Septic System Repairs and Future Stormwater Projects**

ARKVILLE, N.Y., December 13, 2021– On December 7, the Catskill Watershed Corporation (CWC) Board of Directors approved funding for several projects in the Septic and Future Stormwater Programs.

Eight homeowners in six towns in Delaware, Greene, and Ulster Counties were awarded reimbursement grants for septic repairs or replacements.

The CWC Board approved reimbursements for NYCDEP required stormwater controls for several projects within the five county West of Hudson Watershed.

This included reimbursing a business in the Town of Shandaken for NYCDEP required stormwater costs for the improvements to an existing hotel, restaurant, and spa. The stormwater controls include stormwater planters, and diffusion of collected stormwater.

The CWC Board also approved reimbursement for NYCDEP required stormwater controls for a new Tractor Supply Store in the Town of Harpersfield. The stormwater controls include a pre-treatment hydrodynamic separator, a bioretention basins, as well as a sand filter to treat stormwater runoff from the site for years to come.

A property owner in the Town of Hunter was approved for reimbursement of design costs for stormwater controls required by NYCDEP for a residential subdivision in the Town of Hunter. The stormwater controls utilize green infrastructure practices including bioretention areas, stormwater planters, rain gardens and level spreaders to vegetated filter strips.

The CWC is a locally based and locally staffed non-profit Local Development Corporation responsible for several environmental protection, economic development, and education programs in the New York City Watershed West of the Hudson River.  
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
