The project was previously approved for \$29,886.24. During installation of the septic the contractor damaged the spring line that was in the middle of the proposed leach field area. Due to the damage the spring line pump also burned out. As a result, the contractor had to reroute the spring line and replace the damaged pump. Due to the tight space and the contractor having to keep the driveway open he needed additional restoration for the area where the material was staged. While installing the septic tank and pump chamber the contractor encountered a large amount of ground water. The contractor had to utilize dewatering pumps for numerous hours in order to keep the tank holes dry while setting the tanks. The septic tank was set in place of a very large cesspool that had to be decommissioned. This required the contractor to install an additional 20 c.y. of stone. The contractor has asked to be reimbursed \$7,037.88 for the added work. We believe the cost is reasonable and just. We are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept the additional cost of \$7,037.88 for a total project cost of \$36,924.12.

The project was previously approved for \$45,323.01. After the curtain drain was installed, water continued to seep out of the bank. As a result, the engineer had the contractor extend the curtain drain an additional 60 feet. Water continued to impact the system, so the engineer had the contractor install a second curtain drain and outlet pipe to catch the water. Due to a variation in topography the contractor was required to install an additional 60 c.y. of absorption fill to complete the system. 5 huge willow trees and stumps were removed as part of the repair leaving large voids where the stumps were. As a result, the contractor had to bring in random fill material to fill in the holes. The Presby field also required an additional 6 c.y. of C-33 material. The contractor has asked to be reimbursed \$10,002.52x60%=\$6,001.51 for the added work. We believe the cost is reasonable and just. We are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept the additional cost of \$6,001.51 for a total project cost of \$51,324.52.

The project was previously approved for \$41,119.24. The material excavated from the tank hole and piping to the field was unsuitable for backfill. As a result, the contractor had to bring in 30 c.y. of random fill material to back fill with. Due to a slight variation in topography the contractor needed an additional 16 c.y. of absorption fill material to complete the leach field area. The contractor has asked to be reimbursed \$1,115.22x60%=\$669.13 for the added work. We believe the cost is reasonable and just. We are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept the additional cost of \$669.13 for a total project cost of \$41,788.37.

The DEC required pressure testing after the sewer extension was installed. The contractor has asked to be reimbursed \$14,000.00 for the added work. We believe the cost is reasonable and just. We are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept the additional cost of \$14,000.00 for a total project cost of \$113,895.00.

After the contractor cut all of the trees and prepped the leach field area for sand it was determined that the septic tank and dosing chamber would not be able to get gravity to the new field. The contractor encountered multiple lines leaving the house and had to rework the plumbing. The field also had to be shifted further down the hill to keep gravity. Additional trees needed to be cut and the contractor had to restore the disturbed area. The contractor has asked to be reimbursed \$11,000.00 for the added work. We believe the cost is reasonable and just. We are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept the additional cost of \$11,000.00 for a total project cost of \$45,901.05.

We believe the cost is reasonable and just. We are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept the additional cost of \$2,000.00 for a total project cost of \$50,625.09.

The project was previously approved for \$8,400.00 for the installation of a 1000 gallon septic tank. Most of the major components include one 1250 gallon septic tank, 390 l.f. of gravity pipe, one distribution box, one effluent filter, 188 c.y. of absorption fill material, 120 l.f. of Presby pipe, 15 c.y. of C-33 sand, 5 clean outs, plumbing modification, and site restoration. We received three quotes: \$46,945.00, \$48,350.00, and \$49,800.00. The quote is within 10% of our estimated cost of construction. Therefore, we are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept this additional cost of \$46,945.00 for a total project cost of \$55,345.00.

The project was previously approved for \$95,778.99. During the installation of the leach field and septic tank the contractor encountered rock. As a result, the contractor had to hammer for 87.5 hours to achieve the appropriate depth. The contractor needed additional fill material to replace the excessive rock and spread and reclaim the rock on site. The contractor has asked to be reimbursed \$43,057.96 for the added work. We believe the cost is reasonable and just. We are requesting that the Septic Committee recommend to the Board of Directors that they accept the additional cost of \$43,057.96 for a total project cost of \$138,836.95.

<u>Jeffrey Clement Second Time Repair:</u> The property is located in the Town of Hamden SBL: 235-1-30. This project was paid for in 2013 under our Priority 3 Program under a previous homeowner. The pump was no longer working and has since been replaced. The homeowner had maintenance pump out done in 2025. Discussion:

<u>Delmar Crim Second Time Repair:</u> The property is located in the Town of Delhi SBL: 125-2-20. This project was paid for in 2007 under our Priority 4 Program under a previous homeowner. The level in the pump chamber is high and it seems like the leach field is no longer accepting effluent. The pump seems to kick on but the level in the pump chamber does not go down. The homeowner had maintenance pump out done in 2025. Discussion:

Joseph Grimm Second Time Repair: The property is located in the Town of Middletown, SBL: 347-1-1.1. This project was paid for in 2010 under our Priority 5 Program under a previous owner. The pump is not working. It will not run manually or when floats are manipulated. There may be wiring issues. The septic tank was pumped in 2025. We don't know if the previous owner had pump outs done. Discussion:

Dana Hommel Second Time Repair: The property is located in the Town of Hunter SBL: 197.00-3-1. This project was paid for in 1999 under our Coordinator Program. The taper of the leach field is starting to leak effluent and the tank is surcharged and backing up into the house. The homeowner had maintenance pump outs done in 2004 and 2025. Discussion:

Robert Janiszweski Second Time Repair: The property is located in the Town of Hunter SBL: 181.11-1-41. This project was paid for in 2015 under our Priority 8 Program. The pump was no longer working and has since been replaced. The homeowner had maintenance pump out done in 2025. Discussion:

<u>Jeanie Scotti Second Time Repair:</u> The property is located in the Town of Jewett SBL: 113.00-4-10. This project was paid for in 2010 under our Priority 5 Program. The floats are no longer working and need to be replaced. The homeowner had maintenance pump out done in 2022. Discussion:
